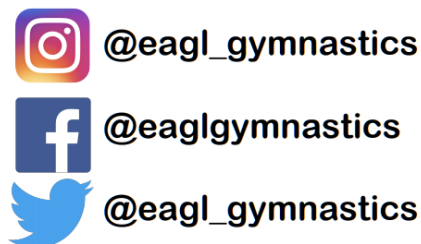

Gymnast of the Week - Senior Deana Sheremeta (Circleville, N.Y.) from George Washington was voted EAGL Gymnast of the Week on Jan 14. Sheremeta made her all around debut and earned the win with a 39.025, competing on vault for the first time. The senior also won the individual beam title with a 9.850.

Specialist of the Week - Senior Celia Trotter (Nashville, Tenn.) from Towson was voted EAGL Specialist of the Week on Jan 14. Trotter won the beam title with a 9.850. This was her first victory on beam since February 21, 2025.

Rookie of the Week - Freshman Aspen Tucker (Suwanee, Ga.) from George Washington was voted EAGL Rookie of the Week on Jan 14. In her first ever collegiate meet, Tucker debuted in the all around. The freshman scored higher than a 9.700 in three events. She also took fifth place on floor with a 9.800 and earned the Revolutionaries' second-highest floor score of the night.

Rookie Specialist of the Week - Freshman Alison Mun (Loudon County, Va.) from George Washington was voted EAGL Rookie Specialist of the Week on Jan 14. Mun made her collegiate debut, competing on vault. The freshman won the event title with a

9.875.

Weekly Highlights

George Washington

- Current record: 1-2 (0-0 EAGL)
- Week Two outcome: Third place (193.200) at Maryland (195.700) with New Hampshire (194.500) and LIU (190.400)
- George Washington opened the season at Maryland's Terrapin Quad, earning a 193.200 to take third overall.
- The Revolutionaries earned rotation scores of 48.000 or higher on vault, bars, and floor and earned the No. 1 spots in three events including the all-around.
- Four first-years were featured in GW's starting lineup.

LIU

- Current record: 0-3 (0-0 EAGL)
- Week Two outcome: Fourth place (190.400) at Maryland (195.700) with New Hampshire (194.500) and George Washington (193.200)
- LIU competed in its season opener recording a score of 190.400.
- Eden Stippick and Camille Rasmussen both made their college debuts and both hit their two respective routines of the evening.
- Raphaelle Perreault made her all around debut, competing on bars for the first time for the Sharks.

New Hampshire

- Current record: 2-1 (0-0 EAGL)
- Week Two outcome: Second place (194.500) at Maryland (195.700) with George Washington (193.200) and LIU (190.400)
- New Hampshire recorded the second-highest team score of the meet (194.500)
- The Wildcats' bars score ranked second among teams (48.775).
- Three UNH gymnasts earned top-three individual event placements: Serena Mullin (T3rd on bars and

floor), Zoe Arthur (T3rd on bars), and Gwen Ockerbloom (3rd on beam)

Temple

- Current record: 2-3 (0-0 EAGL)
- Week Two outcome: Third place (193.875) at Florida (197.725) with North Carolina (196.675) and West Virginia (193.450)
- Temple saw continued success by newcomers in last week's meet while getting consistent performances from returning student-athletes. Freshmen Ella Beck and Brooklyn Thomas each competed on three events for the Owls, performing well in their own right.
- Sophomore Robyn Dunne continued to post high scores for the Owls against top-level competition. Dunne competed on floor for the first time in her young career and put up a 9.800. The lowest score she's had this year is a 9.700 and leads Temple with three scores of 9.800 or greater.
- Sophomore Nikki Rengifo competed twice in the meet at Florida and posted two season-high scores (9.800) on vault and floor.

Towson

- Current record: 1-1 (0-0 EAGL)
- Week Two outcome: Win (195.325) at home against West Chester (187.900)
- Towson won all four events vs. West Chester in a dual meet.
- The Tigers had top-three scores on all four events plus the top two all-around scores.
- There were two 49+ team events: 49.225 on floor and 49.025 on bars.
