GYMNAST OF THE WEEK:

Senior Morgan Lane (Columbus, Ind.) earned Gymnast of the Week Honors after tying her career records on vault, beam, and floor while also besting her all-around personal record by 0.150 in the final home meet of her career. En route to leading the Tar Heels to a season-high 196.600, Lane earned one of Carolina's top three scores in each event, receiving the Tar Heels' top score on beam (9.950, 1st), second-highest score on vault (9.875, 2nd) and floor (9.925, 2nd), and third-highest score on bars (9.800, T-6th). Lane won the all-around in UNC's meet (39.550), posting the highest score in EAGL during Week Eleven. She never fell below the 39.000 mark in her eight all-around appearances this season and now holds the fifth-highest all-around score in the history of Carolina gymnastics.

SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK:

Sophomore Khazia Hislop (Concord Mass.) earned her fourth Specialist of the Week Award after averaging 9.925 across three events, helping UNC to a league win against Pittsburgh. Hislop's performance marks her second time this season earning 9.900+ in all three of her events. Hislop's vault score of 9.900 earned her first-place for the fifth consecutive meet and for the eighth time this season (out of ten competitions). Hislop stood on the podium for floor exercise in her eighth consecutive and ninth total meet after tying her career-high score of 9.950. The sophomore also set a new personal best on beam (9.925).

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Freshman Haley Brechwald (Springfield, Va.) of Pittsburgh and Lauren Kent (Willow Springs, NC) of NC State shared Rookie of the Week Honors. For Brechwald, this is her sixth honor of the season. In Pitt's dual against UNC, she reached the podium on vault (9.850) and floor (9.875), finishing tied for third on both, while earning a runner-up finish in the all-around (39.300). Kent earned her first weekly honor after scoring a pair of 9.850's in NC State's 3-1 finish in a five-meet at Towson. Kent tied her career-highs on bars and beam, placing fourth and tied-for-sixth, respectively. As a freshman, she has seen action in each meet this season.

WEEK ELEVEN RECAP:

Towson (13-16/0-9)

2-2 at Towson (1. WVU 196.775, 2. NC State 196.550, 3. Towson 196.425, 4. Cornell 193.500, 5. William & Mary 193.025)

- En route to scoring the fourth-highest team total in school history, Towson began the meet on vault with McKellar taking third with a career-high 9.850 while Cortni Baker finished fifth with a 9.825. Yarussi was the third Tiger to finish in the top eight as she finished in a three-way tie for eighth with a 9.775.
- McKellar and Baker were also the top two finishers for Towson on bars as McKellar also placed third with a 9.875 while Baker and freshman Tess Zeintek tied for sixth at 9.800. Brittney Ranti came in 12th with a 9.775, just below her career high of 9.800.
- The Tigers placed two in the top three on beam and three in the top-10, led by Yarussi and Mary Elle Arduino who each tied for second with a 9.900. Meanwhile, Katie McGrady tied her career high with a 9.825 to finish 10th.
- Towson saved its best performance for last, placing four gymnasts in the top six and five in the top-10 on floor as the team totaled a season-high 49.400 which was the highest of the five team scores in the event. Yarussi took home first with a career-high 9.925 while Baker, McGrady and McKellar all tied for fourth with a 9.875 which was a career best for McGrady. Sophomore Melissa Temkov just missed her career high by 0.025 points as she placed 10th with a 9.850. McKellar was the lone Tiger to placed in the all-around as she finished third with a 39.400 which ties her for the fifth-highest score in school history.

UNC (8-8/2-3)

1-0 against Pittsburgh (UNC: 196.600, Pitt: 196.050)

- Carolina sent off its four seniors with a season-high 196.600, the sixth-highest score in Carolina gymnastics history.
- Over the course of the meet, UNC collectively matched seven individual career-highs and set five new personal records across all four events and the all-around competition. Five gymnasts set new season-highs in the meet and eight gymnasts either matched or bested their career-highs, including three seniors.
- Carolina set new season records on bars (49.175), floor (49.475), and overall (196.600) and extended the streak of 49.000+ on both vault and floor to seven straight meets.

NC State (19-8/6-1)

3-1 at Towson (1. WVU 196.775, 2. NC State 196.550, 3. Towson 196.425, 4. Cornell 193.500, 5. William & Mary 193.025)

- NC State's score of 196.550 was its third-highest score on the season
- Competing against four other teams, the Pack earned ten top-five finishes
- NC State's 49.375 on floor was its second-highest floor score of the season

Pittsburgh (6-14/3-2)

0-1 at UNC (UNC: 196.600, Pitt: 196.050)

- The University of Pittsburgh gymnastics team recorded the second-highest road score in program history after tallying a 196.050 Saturday afternoon at North Carolina's Carmichael Arena in Chapel Hill, N.C.
- Falling just short of the top road score (196.100) which was set earlier this season at TWU, Pitt dropped the meet to the Tar Heels 196.600-196.050, but saw 10 top-five finishes by eight Panthers.
- Freshman standout Haley Brechwald earned two top five finishes on floor and vault, while junior Lucy Brett finishing in the top five on bars and beam.

GW (21-6/5-0)

1-1 at Kent State (1. Kent State 196.325, 2. GW 195.650, 3. Temple 195.075)

- GW earned its 195.650 behind team scores of 48.975 on vault, 48.075 on uneven bars, and season-high matching scores of 49.275 on balance beam and 49.352 on floor exercise.
- In the all-around, senior co-captain Jillian Winstanley eclipsed the 39.000 threshold for the 10th time this season with a 39.375. The Arlington, Massachusetts, native also finished the day at the top of the podium with a 9.900 on vault.
- The Colonials finished with a season-high matching 49.325 on floor. The senior-duo of Cami Drouin-Allaire and Madeline Seibold earned second-place honors with identical 9.925s. For Drouin-Allaire, the 9.925 marks the fifth time this season she's scored above a 9.900, while the 9.925 marks a career-high for Seibold, the second-straight meet she has topped her personal best.
- Jillian Winstanley also had a solid performance for GW, registering a 9.850, Sara Mermelstein scored a 9.825, and Catherine Karpova finished with a 9.800 in her floor lineup debut.

UNH (11-6/3-3)

1-0 at UIC (1. UNH 195.700, 2. UIC 194.775)

- Danielle Mulligan, EAGL's top-ranked uneven bar competitor, equaled her personal best and matched the highest bar score (9.925) scored by any EAGL gymnast this season to win that event and spearhead UNH's 195.700-194.775 victory against the University of Illinois at Chicago on Sunday at the UIC Pavilion.
- On vault, the Wildcats posted their best score of the meet (49.025). Five of UNH's six gymnasts placed in the Top 5: Nicole O'Leary headlined the effort with a 9.875 to top the podium. Marissa Toci tied for second place (9.825), Erin Carroll, Lauren Diggan and Danielle Doolin each registered a 9.775 to share fourth-place honors.
- Casey Lauter, EAGL's No. 1-ranked balance beam competitor, won that event for the ninth time this season with a 9.825. She shared first place with teammate Riley Freehling.
