GYMNAST OF THE WEEK:

Senior Cami Drouin-Allaire (Shoreham, New York) from George Washington University earned her second EAGL Gymnast of the Week honor on February 13th after tallying the highest EAGL all-around during Week Six as the Colonials went 1-1 in a tri-meet, behind Denver and ahead of WVU. Drouin-Allaire finished on the podium with a second-place finish on vault (9.900), third-place finish on floor (9.875), and second-place finish with season-high matching 39.400 in the all-around. She also led the team in both events and all-around. She added a 9.800 on bars (tied fifth) and 9.825 on beam (fifth). The biology major and senior co-captain has broken the 39.000 threshold in the all-around five out of the six weeks of competition so far this season. She has scored above a 9.900 on vault three times in 2018.

SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK:

Junior Nicole O'Leary (Newtown, Conn.) of the University of New Hampshire was honored for the first time this season as EAGL Specialist of the Week on February 13th after earning a perfect 9.900 on vault to help lead the Wildcats to a conference win over Towson University. O'Leary's impressive vault score was a career-high and the highest possible score for her front handspring front pike vault. The 9.900 is tied for the second-highest score on vault in EAGL this season. She won the event and led the UNH vault lineup to their highest score this season (48.975). O'Leary added a score of 9.850 on floor which earned her second place.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Freshman Haley Brechwald (Springfield, Va.) collected her fourth overall and second-straight EAGL Rookie of the Week award on February 13th after winning the all-around for the fourth time this season as the Panthers picked up wins against NC State and Texas Women's University, but finished behind Auburn in a quad meet. Her 39.325 in the all-around was a career-high and was good enough to beat out six other gymnasts. The mark was the seventh-best in program history. Brechwald also finished in a four-way tie for second on bars after tying her season-high, 9.875. She was one of three 9.875 scores by Pitt on bars, en route to the second highest event score in program history. Additionally, Brechwald posted a season-high tying 9.875 on floor to finish fifth overall in the meet and tied for sixth on beam with a season-high 9.825.

- •Seniors Cami Drouin-Allaire and Jillian Winstanley both finished the night on the all-around podium. Drouin-Allaire finished second with a season-high matching 39.400 while Winstanely ended the night in a close third with a 39.350
- •GW had its best event of the night on vault, where the team posted a 49.175. Drouin-Allaire once again proved her prowess on vault with a team-high 9.900, while Winstanley earned a 9.875. Liz Pfeiler, Zois, and Mermelstein also posted solid scores for GW, with Pfeiler finishing with a 9.850, Zois scoring a season-high 9.825, and Mermelstein earning a 9.725.

- •The Tar Heels set a new season-best overall score of 195.750 and also three new season-high rotation scores on vault (49.175), floor exercise (49.275), and beam (49.225).
- •Five gymnasts collectively set two new personal records and tied six career-best scores across all events. Additionally, Carolina improved upon nine individual scores to set new season bests for seven different student-
- •This is the second time since 2009 that Carolina has earned three rotation scores of at least 49.000 in the same meet. Carolina also scored at least 49.000 in three rotations last week (vault, bars, floor) which makes this the first time in over 16 years that Carolina has scored 49.000 or above in three rotations in back-to-back meets.

Pittsburgh (4-7/3-1)

- •Pitt posted its highest road total in program history and fifth-highest program score after tallying a 196.100.
- •The Panthers highest event mark was a 49.250 on bars, which was also the previous school record before breaking it early this season. The squad matched No. 15 Auburn on the event.
- •Freshman Haley Brechwald earned her fourth all-around title of the year with a season-high 39.325, which marks the seventh highest all-around score in program history.
- •Pitt's beam score, 49.050, marks the seventh-highest score in program history on the event.
