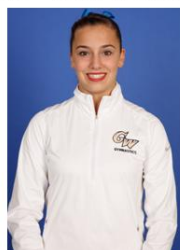

GYMNAST OF THE WEEK:

Senior Cami Drouin-Allaire (Shorham, New York) of George Washington was voted EAGL Gymnast of the Week on January 9th after leading the Colonials to a third-place finish in a quad meet at No. 10 Kentucky this past weekend. The Biology major won the all-around competition in front of a sold-out crowd, with a total score of 39.100. This is the thirteenth time in the past 15 meets that the senior has eclipsed the 39.000 all-around mark. Drouin-Allaire placed third on both vault (9.825) and floor (9.850), while adding a 9.725 on bars and a 9.700 on beam. She earned the highest floor score (along with teammates Jillian Winstanley and Madeline Siebold) and also tallied the highest all-around score in EAGL during the first weekend of competition.

SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK:

Senior Casey Lauter (Northport, New York) of New Hampshire was tabbed as the first EAGL Specialist of the Week for the 2018 season after winning the beam title at the Little Boston Invitational (against Temple, Maryland, and Towson), with a 9.925. Not only was this mark her highest score since January 30th, 2016, it was the highest score posted on any event in EAGL this past weekend and it also ties Peng-Peng Lee of UCLA and Sarah Finnegan of LSU with the top-beam score in the nation during Week One. Lauter anchored a UNH beam lineup that scored a 49.150 which currently holds a No. 2 national ranking along with Arkansas. The senior co-captain helped the Wildcats to total the top-team score in EAGL during Week One, a 194.175.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

Freshman Lauren Diggan (Sinking Spring, Pa.) of New Hampshire earned EAGL Rookie of the Week honors on January 9th for her three-event performance contributing to the Wildcats' top team score in EAGL posted this past weekend. In her collegiate debut, Diggan was the lone Wildcat to achieve a 9.700 or above in three events. She matched teammates Erin Carroll and Marissa Toci for the Wildcats' top vault score (9.750, tied 7th). Additionally, she was one of only two Wildcats (Danielle Doolin) to compete in three events and compiled top aggregate score of all UNH competitors (29.175; 9.750 vault, 9.700 Bars, 9.725 floor).

WEEK ONE RECAP:

GW:

Ball State (2-1, 194.475), GW (1-2, 193.775), and Southeast Missouri (0-3, 189.675) @ Kentucky (3-0, 196.075)

•Senior Cami Drouin-Allaire took the all-around title by scoring a 39.100. Drouin-Allaire came in tied-for-third on vault (9.825) and floor (9.850). The Shoreham, New York native, rounded out her evening with a 9.725 on bars and 9.700 on beam.

•GW finished in second-place on vault (48.750) and floor (49.075).

•Four Colonials finished the evening on the podium. Along with Drouin-Allaire, Jillian Winstanley finished third on vault (9.825) and floor (9.850), while Madeline Seibold scored a 9.850 on floor to tie-for-third with her teammates. Alex Zois also took third-place in the all-around (38.900).

UNH:

•UNH scored a 49.150 on balance beam. That mark is tied for No. 2 nationally with Arkansas.

•The Wildcats were originally scheduled to compete at Arizona, but a winter storm Thursday altered the plans, forcing the switch to the quad-meet in Boston's Hynes Convention Center.

•UNH, which improved its score in all four rotations (floor, vault, bars, beam) is ranked 19th in the RoadtoNationals.com Top 25 through all meets Jan. 6th.

Towson:

Temple (3-0, 194.875), UNH (2-1, 194.175), Maryland (1-2, 194.100), Towson (0-3, 193.800) @ Little Boston Invite

•The Tigers were led by two first-place finishes from Tyra McKellar (AA) and Courtnei Baker (Vault).

•Towson totaled 193.800 points which was just a tenth of a point short of last year's season-opening score of 193.900 against Southern Connecticut State which is the highest in program history for a season opener.

•The Tigers had the second-highest score on floor with a 48.725.

•Towson had two of the top three scores on vault en route to a 47.950.

•The Wolfpack went undefeated in a tri-meet against Northern Illinois and the University of Illinois-Chicago during head coach Kim Landrus' coaching debut with NC State.
